The Sunday School is excited to start practicing for their Christmas Eve Program and they welcome everyone to attend on December 24 at 7:30 pm. It is always a magical evening.

#### **Adult Education / Bible Study**

Our Adult Education program continues with its final 6 sessions. The program is titled "Eclipsing Empire: Paul, Rome, and the Kingdom of God" which explores Paul's message of "the Kingdom of God" as a radical alternative to the Roman Empire's rule in the 1st century.

Biblical scholars John Dominic Crossan and the late Marcus Borg invite participants to rediscover Paul not as a theologian obsessed with individual salvation or sin, but as a courageous visionary of social transformation and equality rooted in the life and message of Jesus.

The title "Eclipsing Empire" refers to Paul's conviction that God's empire of justice and peace would ultimately outshine and replace the empire of Caesar, not through violence, but through love, community, and faithfulness.

We meet every Tuesday evening at 7pm in the sanctuary. ALL are welcome to attend.




